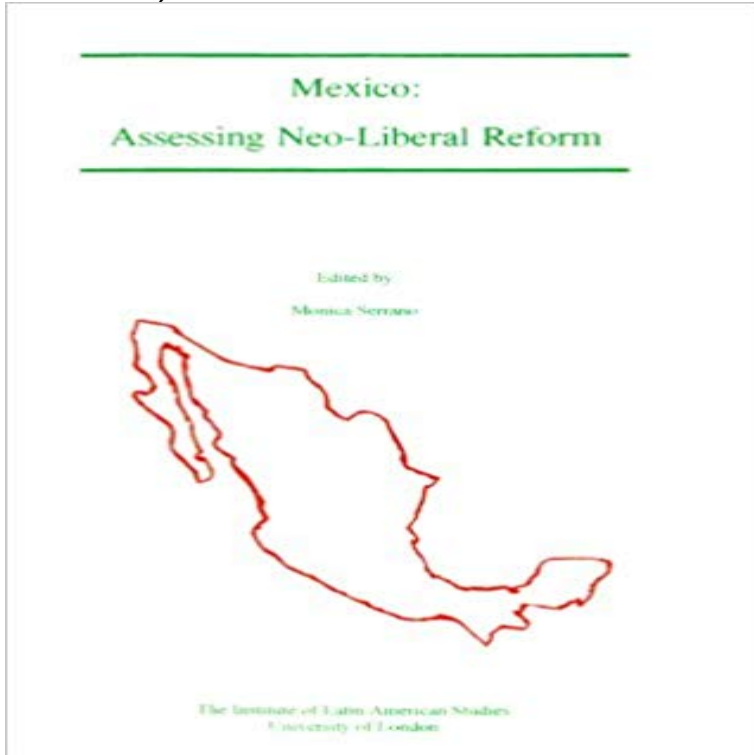


Mexico: Assessing Neo-Liberal Reform (Institute of Latin American Studies)
